

# UNLV Rebels Lose To Oregon

LAS VEGAS, NEV. — Prior to the start of the 1980 UNLV football season, experts were saying that the Rebels would be playing the toughest schedule in the history of the sport (which started in 1968) at the university.

By that prognosis, then, UNLV head coach

Tony Knap should be pleased that his team is 5-2 at this point in the 1980 season with one road game and three home games left on the regular-season schedule.

Coach Knap and his staff and players are happy to be 5-2 instead of something less than

that, but UNLV will take a long time to forget and heal from the 32-9 licking it received last Saturday afternoon on a chilly and rainy afternoon in Eugene, Oregon, to the University of Oregon.

UNLV's offense, which had been averaging 459 yards per game in total offense and 39.5 points per game, was held in virtual check by the talented Oregon defensive front four and the Rebels came up with only 206 total yards and nine points, the lowest offensive output of the season.

On defense, the Rebels did play a respectable, if not great, game. The Big Red "D" did give up four touchdowns, three through the air, and 406 total yards, but, it could have been worse. The defense did come up with two fumble recoveries and two quarterback sacks and did hold the Oregon running game in check throughout the game.

After seven games, UNLV's offensive attack is now averaging 422.9 yards per game in total offense, with 181.9 coming on the ground and 242.0 through the air. The Rebels are averaging 35.1 points per game at present.

On defense, the Rebels are allowing 311.9 yards per game in total offense, with 123.3 on the ground and 188.6 passing. The Big Red "D" is giving up an average of 20.9 points per game at this point in 1980.

Individually, Senior flanker Sam Greene continues to lead UNLV in scoring and receiving, junior Michael Morton is still tops in rushing and senior quarterback Larry Gentry is still the number one Rebel passer.

Greene, who did not score a touchdown against Oregon but did

catch five passes, has nine touchdowns for 54 points. He has also caught 32 passes for 640 net yards, a 20.0 per catch average and nine touchdowns. He is averaging 4.6 receptions per game.

Senior split end Robert Cobb is second in Rebel receiving with 16

catches for 201 net yards, a 12.6 per catch average and four touchdowns.

UNLV plays its final road game of the 1980 regular season Saturday night at New Mexico. The Rebels will be at home for their final three games against Wyoming, Hawaii and BYU.
