The Nucleus Associates, a non-profit Local Development Company, will host a community public forum, Thursday, November 20, at 7:30 p.m. at the Mabel Hoggard Elementary School, located at 950 N. Tonopah Drive in Las Vegas.

The public forum will provide open community meeting for Las Vegas

who wish to see a full-service shopping center in the West Las Vegas area. Focus will be placed on plans to address the needs of the community through redevelopment of the Golden West Shopping Center, a project taken on by the Nucleus Associates Local Development Company Members. (The Local Development Company,

LDC, is a tributary to the Nucleus investment corporation.)

The foremost objectives of the Local Development Company are to relieve poverty, reduce neighborhood tensions, and community deterioration. In addition, the LDC will serve to promote, encourage, support, finance and/or expand programs for organizations and individuals who are actively involved in economic development of Clark County, Nevada, with particular emphasis on those portions of West and North Las Vegas designated as the Special Impact Area.

LDC members are hopeful that representatives from the Small Business Administration, City of Las Vegas, County and State entities, Business and Economic Development sector, will address community concerns as it relates to: (1) public services (2) retail services and (3) public transportation, ect. Invitation is open to the

community at large to present thoughts and suggestions in regard to the following:

- A. What existing shops at the Golden West Shopping Center meet your needs?
- B. Do you feel that the Golden West Shopping Center would be a good location for a modified public transportation system?
- C. What types of community services would you like to see made available at the Golden West Shopping Center?

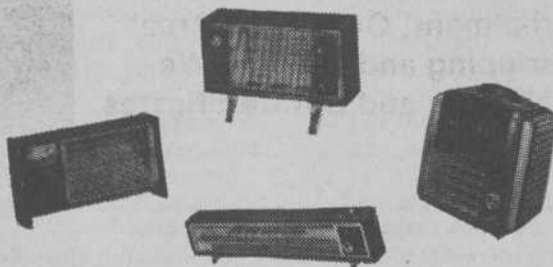

REAGAN FAUXPAS
