CCCC Flight Instruction

Don Flaherty, who is rated as a Gold Seal Flight Instructor, will teach a course in Private License Aviation and a course in Instrument License Aviation beginning in January with registration to begin at Clark County Community College, Nov. 10 through 13 and Dec. 9 through 23, Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The Private License Aviation course is scheduled for Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7:30 to 10 p.m. at the North Las Vegas Air Terminal beginning January 20. It is an in-depth course of instruction in aviation operation with emphasis on light aircraft. The class is designed to prepare the student for the FAA Private Pilot's written examination.

The Instrument License Aviation course will be a Monday and Wednesday class from 7:30 -10 p.m. & will be held at the North Las Vegas Air Terminal. The course offers instruction in IFR operations with emphasis on ATC and aviation weather. It will prepare students for the Instrument Rating (Airplane) written examination.
