Rev. Jackson Outlines Resistance Plan Against Reagan Program

Tempe, Ariz. — The Rev. Jesse Jackson outlined a nationwide "political resistance plan" last week to counter the conservative policies of the incoming Reagan administration.

Jackson, the national president of People United to Save Humanity, told a news conference here that the program would include a voter registration drive, a possible economic boycott, the monitoring of the new administration's domestic and foreign policies, and the strengthening of an existing "personal excellence program" operated by PUSH to motivate black youths to greater self-achievement.

"The administration that is about to take office must be monitored," Jackson told reporters. During his campaign, Reagan "appealed to the very base race instincts of white Americans," he said.

"Reagan gave the voters a false sense of

security, nostalgia, a quick fix," Jackson said.

Jackson said blacks and other minorities will not exist "in exile without citizenship" during the Reagan years.

"We are simply on the defensive; gains (of the past) will not be unraveled as are now being proposed."

He predicted that the conservative policies of the new administration will act as a catalyst to bring blacks, Hispanics, women, the labor movement and other groups together on common political interests.

Jackson criticized many of the proposed Republican domestic and foreign policies, saying they would hurt the nation's poor.

He said final plans for an economic boycott would be made at a Dec. 12 PUSH meeting in Chicago. The organization has a list of 20 major American cor-

porations from which "economic reciprocity" for blacks will be asked.
