Caesars Grand Prix Now Under Consideration

Caesars Palace is being considered by the Formula One Constructors Association as one of the sites for the 1981 Grand Prix under the dissident World Federation of Motor Sport. Caesars has been attempting for three years to stage a third U.S. Grand Prix.

It was another round in the nine month old power struggle that has split the world of motor racing.

The dispute was to be settled this past weekend. A proposal from FOCA for a compromise was being studied by the FISA committee. A positive response would mean an end to the conflict and the establishment of one world championship next year.

"We are putting our cards on the table and we can prove everything we say," said FOCA spokesman Max Mosley. "We have 12 contracts to stage Grand Prix next season and written confirmation from nine of these."

The proposals, submitted by three North American motor racing organizers, include the abolition of skirts from the start of the European season — a major concession by the FOCA since the banning of skirts by FISA sparked the present conflict — and the setting up of a nine-man commission to govern Formula One racing.

Caesars Palace has no

race track as yet but would begin construction of one if it is guaranteed a race. FICA had granted Caesars an unacceptable race date for 1980 but none for 1981. The FOCA date for 1981 is Oct. 18.

The war between the two bodies reached a climax Oct. 31 with the FOCA announcement it would stage a rival world championship under the newly-formed WFMS.

Dunes Hosts Open

The \$15,000 Nevada Open Golf Tournament will be held Dec. 9-11 at the Dunes and Tropicana country clubs with \$1,600 going to the professional winner.

Entry forms for the tourney are now available at all area golf courses.

The pro-am will be over the first 36 holes with one round at each course.

The Nevada Open will be 54 holes of medal play with the two-day pro-am scores counting in the total.

Amateurs within eight shots of the lead after 36 holes will be paired with the professionals on the final day at the Dunes. All other amateurs will

play at the Tropicana in a one-day sweepstakes for both low gross and low net prizes.

Registration will be held Dec. 9 prior to the pro-am at both courses. All amateurs are required to have a current USGA handicap card. Amateurs will use full handicaps up to 24 strokes.

Amateurs compete for both low net and low gross.

Entries should be mailed to Nevada Open, Dunes Hotel and Country Club, 3650 Las Vegas Blvd., South, Las Vegas, 89109.

Tournament officials are expecting a field of 50 professionals and 150 amateurs.

Girl Scouts Get Adventure

The Frontier Girl Scout Council is sponsoring a special camping opportunity for Black girls called "The Wyoming Adventure." This project, financed partly through a Reader's Digest grant, is open to all Black girls with limited family income who are in the seventh through eleventh grades in school.

The Girl Scouts will hold two informational meetings on The Wyoming Adventure. The first will be at the A.D. Guy Center at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, December 4th; a similar meeting will be held at the Westside Library at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, December 8th. Applications will be available at the meetings, as well as at county schools and other neighborhood locations. Both non-Scouts and Girl Scouts

are eligible to participate.

Preparation for the summer 1981 trip to Wyoming will begin in January of next year. Hiking, camping, riding and other skills will be taught. Based upon participation and accomplishments, eight girls and four alternates will be selected for the trip through Yellowstone Park to the Girl Scout National Center West in Wyoming. Alternates who don't go to Wyoming will be able to participate in a special Nevada adventure. All financing will be provided by the Girl Scouts, the grant, community contributions and fund raisers.
