# CAESARS PALACE TO HOST PINTOR-DAVILA FIGHT

LAS VEGAS Caesars Palace, in association with Azteca Promotions. Inc., of Los Angeles, will present the WBC World Bantamweight Championship between reigning champion Lupe Pintor of Mexico and number 1 contender Alberto Davila on Friday December 19. 1980 in the Caesars Palace Sports Pavilion. Two featured 10-round fights as well as two other matches are included in the live event.

A special added attraction will be an ABC telecast of the highly fight controversial November 25 in New Orleans between former welterweight champion Roberto Duran and current champion Sugar Ray Leonard. ABC plans a live interview with both fighters originating from Los Angeles following the Pintor vs Davila match, and Caesars Palace will provide giant screen viewing of the Duran-Leonard bout as well as ABC's live community. Doors open at 4:30 p.m. with the first bout scheduled for 5:15 p.m.

Pintor, who won his WBC title at Caesars Palace against Carlos Zarate in 1979 had suffered one of his three career losses against Davila back in 1976. Following that fight, he went on to win 22 straight bouts including 19 knockouts. His total career record now stands at 42-7 with 34 knockouts.

The popular challenger Davila, managed by Benny Georgino of Los Angeles, recently was featured at Caesars Palace on the Sanchez-Lopez card presented by Five Star Promotions on June 21st, 1980 in which he scored a second round knockout over Richie Rozelle. He has since fought two more times, extending his record to 40-6, including 20 knockouts.
