CTS VICTORY AT CAESARS

LAS VEGAS - Alberto Davila has been called a 'boxer,' quick hands with excellent boxing skills - but lacking the big punch, the power to make him what one would call a "crowd pleaser."

"That's a bad rap," said Davila, the world's ranked bantamweight contender from Pomona, California. "I've had five fights this year and won them all by knockout. Does that sound like I can't punch?"

Friday night, December 19, at Caesars Palace, Davila will get a third chance to disprove the "bad rap," as he puts it. He'll go for "the charm," his third crack at the world's bantamweight championship against Mexico's devastating puncher Lupe Pintor.

"Let Pintor stick his chin out and see what will happen. I'll flatten him. If Owen could punch he'd have stopped Pintor when they fought. Owen hit Pintor easily but couldn't hurt him. I know I can hit Pintor, that's no problem - and you can bet I'll hurt him. I think I have an excellent chance to stop him on cuts in the 12th or 13th round."

The Owen-Pintor match Davila speaks of was the September 19 match at the Olympic Auditorium in Los Angeles that saw Pintor, with bad cuts over both eyes, rally to stop Owen in the 12th round. Owen died as a result of injuries from that match.

"Pintor is still mad because of my win over him in 1976. I feel I won at least seven of the 10 rounds. He's still crying. This time, though, it's for all the marbles. Pintor is not in my class as a boxer and my recent knockout record proves I can hold my own with him as a puncher."

Davila, mild mannered and soft spoken, claims he should have worn the 118 pound crown in
