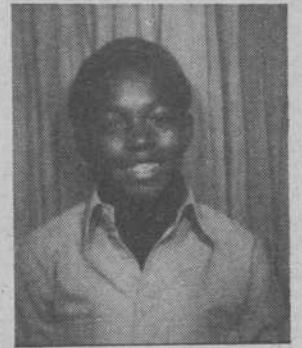
School Lunch Cost Up
