JSU TO HONOR MARGARET WALKER ALEXANDER

Jackson State University will hold a special convocation to honor Dr. Margaret Walker Alexander, a noted author, poetess and retired educator, at 10 a.m. Thursday, April 9 in Dansby Hall Auditorium.

The special convocation will pay tribute to the former JSU English professor in recognition of her donation of a special collection of artifacts to the University's H.T. Sampson Library.

The guest speaker for the program will be Dr. Lerone Bennett, Jr., senior of Ebony Magazine and author of the book, "Before the Mayflower." Dr. Bennett is a native of Clarksdale, Mississippi and is an internationally respected journalist and historian.

Scheduled to pay tribute to Dr. Alexander during the program are Dr. Jerry Ward, associate professor of English at Tougaloo College, Mrs. Bernice Bell, assistant director of the JSU Library, the Reverend Wendell Taylor, retired pastor of Central United Methodist Church, and Mrs. Tommie Stewart, assistant professor of speech and dramatic arts at JSU, who will read selections from the poetic works by Dr. Alexander.

JSU President Dr. John A. Peoples, Jr. will accept the distinguished author's donation of manuscripts, private papers and letters from the University. The collection will be permanently housed in the Margaret Walker Alexander Room on the fourth floor of the library.

Born in Birmingham, Alabama, Dr. Alexander graduated as salutatorian of her high school class at the age of 14, received the bachelor of arts degree at Northwestern and earned with distinction the master's and doctor's degrees at the University of Iowa.

She began her teaching career at Jackson State, coordinated the first Humanities Program and organized and directed the Institute for the History, Life and Culture of Black People until her retirement in 1979.

An articulate speaker, Dr. Alexander has traveled throughout the state and nation to address numerous literary, social and civic organizations.

In addition to writing six books, five completed during her 30 year tenure at Jackson State, including the celebrated war novel "Jubilee," Dr. Alexander has contributed to many anthologies of poetry and has written more than eighteen scholarly articles and book reviews.
