## Wooster High School Captures State Prep School Track Title

Wooster High School in Reno went out to dethrone the Clark High School Tracksters by a score of 109-68 in the boy's State Track and Field Championship events on Saturday at Douglas High School in Minden, Nevada.

Wooster's Neil Dulbury won the two hurdles events. Clark's only double winner was Mike Dexter who won the 100 meters in 11.11, and the 200 in 22.27.

Dexter said that he was the last one out of the blocks, and the track was too soft, but he still won the race.

The 1600 was won by Andre Woods of Eldorado High School, despite high elevation and high winds. Tony Macey of Valley High School won the 3,200 in 9:37.30.

Hug's Elwood Knox added an emotional touch to the meet. He won the long jump at 23-10, the triple jump at 47 $\frac{1}{4}$ , and the high jump at 6-9. He dedicated the meet to his late father and mother. His father died last year of diabetes, and his mother died of cancer a short time later.

All three relay races were taken by Clark High School of Las Vegas.

Every girl's event except the 1600 was won by Northern Conference schools. Eldorado's sophomore Jackie Love won this event in 9:37.30. She was affected by both the elevation, and the 61 second first lap in the 1600.

The WBC World Junior Middleweight Championship fight between Maurice Hope of England and Wilfred Benitez of Puerto Rico will take place at the Caesars Palace Sports Pavillion on Saturday, May 23, between 1:00 and 2:30 P.M. Hope is the current WBC champion.

Benitez, the former Welterweight Champion, was defeated by Sugar Ray Leonard in November 1979, at the Sports Pavilion.

## Nancy Reagan: Honorary President of Girl Scouts Of the U.S.A.

On Friday, May 15, 1981, Nancy Reagan became the 13th First Lady to serve as Honorary President of the Girl Scouts of the United States of America. Mrs. Reagan comments, "I am delighted to accept this position and have the opportunity to participate in your distinguished organization. Girl Scouting espouses the best of our American traditions—love of Country and God and willingness to be of service to our fellow citizens."

Mrs. Reagan's acceptance of the National honorary Presidency carries on a 64-year unbroken tradition of personal interest and support of the nation's First Ladies. Girl Scouts have held this privilege since 1917, when Mrs. Woodrow Wilson was the first to assume this honorary post, five years after the founding of the Girl Scout movement in this country. Since that time each First Lady of the land has also been "first lady" of Girl Scouting.

The investment ceremony on May 15th began at 11:00 a.m. in the First Lady's garden. Speaking on behalf of the nearly three million girl and adult Girl Scouts in the United States, Girl Scout National President Mrs. Orville L. Freeman installed Mrs. Reagan as the Honorary President. In token of the occasion, Mrs. Freeman presented Mrs. Reagan with the Girl Scout trefoil pin, signifying Girl Scout membership, and the gold bar pin, the official insignia of the First Lady as Honorary President. Mrs. William McLeod Littmann, former president of Girl Scouts of the U.S.A. and currently a member of the World Committee of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts, gave Mrs. Reagan the World Association pin, and Mrs. Frances R. Hesselbein, National Executive Director of Girl Scouts, gave her a miniature trefoil pin.

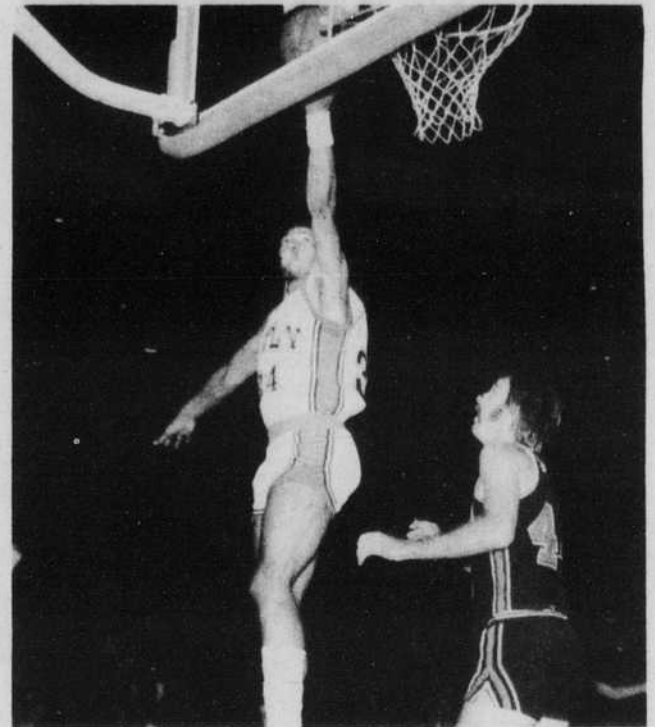

Jackie Robinson, former member of the Runnin' Rebels Basketball team, will conduct a Basketball Camp for youngsters, both boys and girls, from 7 to 18 years of age, beginning on June 8th and ending on June 26, 1981 at North Las Vegas Boys Club, located at 2530 E. Carey, North Las Vegas.

Three separate sessions will be held. The first session will begin on June 8th and end on June 12th, and is for 7 to 10 year olds. The second session runs from June 15th to June 19th, and is for 11 to 14 year olds. The third session begins on June 22nd and runs to June 26th, and is for 15 to 18 year olds.

The camp, founded by Jackie Robinson in 1978, is in its fourth consecutive year.
