Gary Moore Pushes For Job Rights

Gary Moore, former North Las Vegas fireman, is still exerting all his efforts to get the City of North Las Vegas to rehire him. In fact, he is seeking a court order to that effect.

Last week both the city and the North Las Vegas Civil Service Board were cited in a temporary restraining order issued by District Court Judge Howard Babcock on behalf of Moore. The order

prohibits the city from hiring any firefighters unless Moore is offered the job. Twice recently the Civil Service Board refused Moore as a candidate for reemployment with the fire department.

Moore's attempts to become reemployed may be thwarted, however, for the city of North Las Vegas plans to be in court to fight his efforts on May 26, when the case is heard.
