# ACCUSER!

...ask yourself, am I one?

DIABOLOS (Greek Word), an accuser, is used 34 times as a title of Satan, "The Devil" (The English word is derived from the Greek)once of Judas, John 6:70, who in his opposition to God, acted the part of the Devil. Apart from John 6:70, men are never spoken of as Devils.

It is always to be distinguished from Daimon, a Demon. It is found three times: I Tim. 3:11; Il Tim. 3:3 and Tit. 2:3, of false accusers, slanderers.

THINK: Diabolos; an accuser, who led men to arrest Jesus and the men put Jesus in prison. Then

men led Jesus out to death after more men had been called as accusers in a mock trial.

THINK harder: With 120 true believers, Christ was without sin. But in the eyes of all other people, Christ Jesus was only a political criminal, whom they accused of law breaking. The accusers all must have thought the laws of men more important than the laws of God, the Father of all

The accusers were in opposition to God and His laws, but they may not have realized it, as God had already known, until after the death of Jesus.

THINK: Jesus died on the cross, but he said that before this in John 19:11, "Thou couldst have no power at all against me, except it were given thee from above. Therefore, he that delivered me unto thee hath the greater sin." Did he mean his accusers? Was Judas the only (Diabolos) accuser?

Who are you? Do you serve God by accusing your fellow mankind brethren?

Jesus died on the cross, but God the Father arose Christ from the tomb on the 3rd day. His accusers thought the tomb would be his prison of death, but God proved this was in opposition of His will.

THINK hard: Diabolos the accuser, Judas, went to death, not to life, but Christ Jesus was not left in death to rot. Jesus was not an accuser causing men to be put in prison or



### New Church Stresses Proper Health Care

At sea, a ship's captain has time to reflect on what he feels is the meaning of life. Usually, that insight never goes beyond application to his own way of dealing with getting by.

Once in awhile, though, someone comes along who feels there is more to it all than just "reflecting."

In fact, for one veteran sea captain by the name of Charlie Roy , simple reflection isn't nearly enough. He is doing something about his beliefs - in a way that ultimately could affect thousands of lives.

Roy has gone religion, as they say. But hold on. It's not like you might think. Roy isn't your gung-ho "born again" fanatic who so often develops when a person sees the socalled "light."

Rather, he has a newly-formed church called the Church of Ontology, which was founded in 1979 and is headquartered in Las Vegas.

It's philosophy, simply put, gives the individual members the freedom to make their own choices based on their consciousness in all areas of life.

As their booklet, called "A Bible For Today's Living" puts it, "It (is) not important that a person (say) prayers, but it (is) important that a person respect himself and his fellow man."

Plus, and this is where is becoming deeply involved, the church is placing a strong emphasis on health care - especially preventative health and proper nutrition.

"What we need now more than anything else," said Roy, who has become an ordained minister, "are more people who want to become ministers. Through them, we will spread the word about our beliefs and our 'message' about health care."

An intriguing part of that idea, Roy said, is the distribution of 100,000 "around medical emergency identification cards."

Based somewhat on the familiar, nationally known, Medic Alert program, Roy hoping to distribute a far more detailed medical ID card for people to carry around. It covers everything from medical

problems to burial wishes and even approval for donations of parts of the body such as eyes, kidneys and the like. It also has a place to list where a person's last will is located.

"We also will soon be putting blood pressure testing machines at different locations around town," said Roy who has a doctor's degree in comparative religions and once designed a living will that is used as a teaching guide for law students at the University of Florida.

Éventually, Roy said, he hopes that through the church's efforts, the "critical importance that proper nutrition plays in our lives will be spread. That's another reason we are now pushing to get ministers ordained in our church. We will be training them in proper nutrition and they, turn, can emphasize that in their own church dealings."

Roy is well aware that there already are many "cheaple" religions where a person can become a legally ordained minister for just money and very little training.
