back. But he did not give up. Neal fought back.

Sen. Neal finally made his mark in the last Legislature. He, along with Sen. Bill Hernstadt, introduced a strong fire safety law that was finally merged into another measure that was the product of Gov. List's blue-ribbon panel studying the Hilton and MGM Grand Hotel fires.

He gave a stirring speech against the Senate Bill 688, which would have shut down fugitive Joe Conforte's Mustang Ranch brothel near Reno.

Neal argued that banning the brothel would only lead to a wave of illegal prostitution on the Reno streets.

"I am concerned we are going to create a greater problem," Neal said. "Sex is going to be peddled on the streets."

He indicated that only 118 women were arrested last year in Reno for prostitution, compared to 5,970 arrested for the same crime in Clark County.

"The question here is sex," Neal said. "Some people beg for it, some people pay for it and old men and old women pray for it."

Senate colleagues and audiences gave Neal an ovation after he concluded his speech.

One of the stormiest disputes of the session centered around the question of how to split the state's newly created congressional districts. Neal was in the forefront of the Senate battle.

He led the controversial abortion bill fight through hearings in his Senate Human Resources Committee and through the floor debates.

Neal's voting record on many of the bills are shown on page 4 in this issue.

Neal amassed an incredible 98.9 voting percentage and missed only 11 voting opportunities in the 969 roll call votes.
