Undefeated young sensations Mark Holmes and Lonnie Smith head the six-bout undercard on the Aaron Pryor-Lennox Blackmoore World Boxing Association junior welterweight championship fight Saturday, June 27, at the Hacienda Resort Hotel and Casino.

Holmes, the younger brother of World Boxing Council heavyweight champion Larry Holmes, is a middleweight with an 11-0 record. Smith, one of the most highly touted lightweight prospects in the sport today, has a 5-0 record.

Both fights accompany the 15-round feature attraction in which Pryor will defend

his WBA junior welterweight crown against No. 1 contender Blackmoore in the Hacienda's Matador Sports Arena.

The mandatory championship bout will be televised live by ABC on "Wide World of Sports" but will be blacked out in the Las Vegas area.

The big 57-round card begins at 1:15 p.m. and doors to the Matador Sports Arena open at noon.

Tickets are now on sale at the Hacienda. Prices are \$50 for ringside, \$25 for preferred and \$15 for general admission.

Pryor is a hard-hitting and relentless fighter with a 27-0 record and 25 knockouts.
