

Redd Foxx Alimony Hearing Reset For July 22

A hearing on whether comedian Redd Foxx has to continue paying his wife \$2,500 monthly on temporary support pending their divorce has been postponed in District Court until July 22.

District Court Judge Joe Pavlikowski granted the continuance last week, but ordered Foxx to supply a financial statement by the next court date.

Foxx contends that Joi Yun Chi Foxx is able to support herself and that he could no longer afford to make the payments.

Fed Landlord Closes NLV Children Center

The second of two Operation Life child care centers in North Las Vegas closed Tuesday, because their federal landlord has decided to sell the buildings.

Operation Life, a non-profit community service organization, has been operating the day care centers for low-income families since 1974. Ruby Duncan, Executive Director of the organization, said Operation Life was recently notified by the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development that the two centers would have to relocate.

Five paid staff members will lose their jobs as a result of the closing, Duncan said.

at him and drew inspiration and courage from the class he showed in the face of racism.

And there was a black pride too, in Joe's 1938 first-round knockout victory over Max Schmeling, the heavyweight from Hitlerland. It was the U.S. versus Germany; democracy versus totalitarianism; black versus self-proclaimed master race.

Never before or since has a boxing match taken on the freight of

world superpower confrontation — and Joe Louis, a proud black man, was seen by blacks and whites alike as the bearer of America's banner. At a time when our home-grown racists were riding high, Joe Louis made all black people walk taller and prouder.

What a study in contrasts those two men are — Howard Thurman and Joe Louis! Yet each in his own way expressed the great gifts of black people and made the best use of his talents to win not only personal success but to inspire and uplift others.

leadership, with a view toward creating a common program for the future.

7. The attitudes and relations of American blacks towards refugees and undocumented aliens who are perceived to be in competition with blacks for jobs and social services, and how these attitudes and relations affect the process of coalition building.

8. The role of heightened racial identify as a motivating force towards progress and, simultaneously, the role of race consciousness as an impediment towards the development of effective strategy and tactics.

9. How can the educational process be modified to meet the changing needs of the job market?

10. Can new careers be created to meet the needs of the poor? Can the vary nature of work be redefined?

There is a need to bring together the most creative minds in

America to explore those questions. Such a group must try to develop a new social policy for the 1980s, founded upon the results of their philosophical, sociological, and intellectual exploration.

This group, or institute, would need to examine both domestic and foreign policy issues which affect minorities, women, and the poor. For instance, it is imperative to recognize that blacks may lose a vast number of American jobs, not because of discrimination, but because of the shift of labor intensive industry abroad — a fact largely ignored by the black community. There is a clear and urgent need to respond to this and similar developments.

A broad range of very important issues, require from us a serious analysis, and the formulation of new objectives. If we in the civil rights community do not make such an effort, we will continue to hold on to those policies, programs and strategies of the past which demonstrably are failing.

Then wait to answer questions. If you have trouble, dial 0 for operator for assistance. Be sure to report all fires to the Fire Department.
