CCCC Henderson Ahead of schedule, the new Henderson campus of the Clark Community County

College will be staffed and equipped to welcome what college administrators feels. will be the largest enrollment in the facility's nine years of operation.

The Henderson Campus opened in 1972 for 125 students using rented classrooms at St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church on Boulder Highway. In 1975, eleven new courses were adde3d, and the enrollment inc reased to 162 students.

In September, 1981, an enrollment of 1,000 is expected to use the new \$1.9 million dollar facility on an 80 acre site off Horizon Drive at Mosswood, in the heart of residential Henderson.

The instructors include Arnold Friedman (Electronics), Jim Stacey (Welding), Mel Pedras (Drafting), and Bob Lyle (Aircraft Maintenance). The position of an instructor for Ornamental Horticulture is still open.

Registration for Fall classes will take place on August 19 and 20, at the new campus, from 2 to 8 p.m.

CCCC NURSES

The shortage of nurses in Clark County has led to a decision to enlarge the program for Licensed Practical Nurses at Clark County Community Collegé.

Men and women who wish to enter the field of nursing are asked to apply to the college immediately.

The course in Licensed Practical Nursing at CCCC is the only program offered to future practical nurses in Southern Nevada and the college program is rated above the national average in standards.
