#### COMMUNITY CHURCH BROKE GROUND

Groundbreaking ceremonies for Henderson's Community Baptist Church was held Sunday at a two third acre site behind Channel 5 television station at 245 Foster Ave. Pastored by Rev. Sam Roberson, the church becomes the first blackowned church in the history of Henderson.

Rev. Roberson said the opening is scheduled in about a

year and will have 250 to 300 pews, five classrooms, a small kitchen and dining room.

The structure is expected to cost between \$300,000 and \$400,000, Roberson said.

The classrooms will be used for Christian education and community outreach.

Roberson, owner of the Religous Emporium at 1322½ "D" St., said between 800 and 1,000 blacks live in Hen-

The Community Baptist Church was forced to vacate its latest location at the Pittman Women's Club in December. The building was donated to the club several years ago and was recently leased to the city of Henderson. The club plans to use the space for a rehabilitiation office.

The church had been holding services in the education section of Zion Methodist Church at Revere and "H" streets in Las Vegas.

It was reported that the black population has increased in Henderson to such extent that Roberson felt it was time for a permanent church.

Judge Lifts Ban On Church

The restraining order issued by District Court Judge Joe Pavlikowski against Rev. Bervin Oats in June, has been lifted, as has the ban on worship at the Greater Faith Baptist Church. Further, Judge Pavlikowski said at the hearing last Friday that he would not become involved in the internal affairs of the church and told the feuding church members to settle their differences out of court.

Greater Faith Baptist Church was founded and built by the late Rev. Prentiss Walker, who was a prominent leader in the black community. It had been in his name as trustee since 1957, until recently, when in his name as trustee since 1957, until recently, when a new board of trustees filed in court for control of the church.

Annie Walker, the late Rev. Walker's widow, has accused Rev. Oats of misleading her and other church members in order to gain control of the church. Their dispute further centers around her feelings that she is entitled to repayment for the church her husband built. Under an agreement with church leaders after her husband died,

she was promised that she would receive periodic payments for the property. She feels also that Rev. Oats has set up a puppet trustee board that he is now able to manipulate.
