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The trading at this level usually leaves the poor people out. But they are not left out of the economic strain from the resulting pressures of inflation when one country's comparative advantage devaluates the other country's currency and causes high prices, high interest rates and high unemployment.

Another example which indicates that the weld which holds these industrialized countries together is cracking, is the election of Francis Mitterrand as France's Prime Minister. Mitterrand is a Socialist, who has called for the nationalization of some of France's key in-

dustries, an action which was not received too kindly by the United States, especially when our neighboring Canadians are contemplating such an action relative to American oil companies in that country.

Many of these industrialized nations are meeting in Ottawa, Canada at the Chateau Montebello. Such issues as inflation, interest rates and South Africa are on the agenda. Since South Africa has many of the resources that these nations need, it will be interesting to see what type of solution will be arrived at regarding this country.

The world awaits some sort of solution to the problems which these industrialized nations are confronting.

Let us hope that a fair solution can be found.

STRIKE

A threatened strike Monday by Las Vegas Mental Health Center workers who want to remove a patient described as "particularly violent" was averted while a staff psychiatrist evaluates the client.

Administrators of the facility met with mental health technicians twice last week, and the two sides agreed to a 30-day evaluation of the patient. The patient may then be transferred to another facility, if the psychiatrist deems it necessary.

Workers had complained that the male patient, who has been at the facility about a year, has physically assaulted several staffers and has not received adequate treatment.

UNLV DEADLINE EXTENDED

UNLV's admission deadline has been extended from July 15 to Aug. 21, acting admissions director Joe Anne Adler announced Monday.

"We extended the deadline to provide bet-

ter service to the community," Adler explained, adding that prospective students' admission applications, academic transcripts and \$5 fees must be filed with the admissions office by Aug. 21 to qualify

for fall classes beginning Aug. 31. Additional information on procedures may be obtained from the UNLV admissions office.

The West Charleston Lions Club 10th Annual All-Star football game, to be played Aug. 1 at 8 p.m. at Valley High School's Fjord Field, will benefit the Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital's burn center.

Sixty graduates of Southern Nevada high schools will participate in the game.

The Lions have donated \$45,000 to the burn center over the last nine years.

The current burn unit has nine beds and services about 20 outpatients. A new, \$700,000 unit, scheduled to open in April, will house over \$75,000 in equipment.




