With thoughts of World Boxing Council featherweight champion Salvador Sanchez and the World Boxing Association counterpart Eusebio Pedroza in the back of their minds, Rocky Lockridge and Juan LaPorte will clash in a nationally televised, 12-round battle Saturday, Aug. 8, at the Hacienda Resort Hotel and Casino.

The title bout, promoted by Bob Arum's Top Rank, Inc., in conjunction with the Hacienda Hotel, will be for Lockridge's United States Boxing Association featherweight crown.

Doors to the Matador Sports Arena open at 11:30 a.m. with the first fight on the card starting at 12:30 p.m.

Featured on the undercard is undefeated heavyweight Marvin Frazier, son of former world heavyweight champion Joe Frazier.

to swim by diving for pennies in the Athens Park public pool.

When some of her children were still very young, Mildred Sampson would take them to a small stable tucked away in a nearby industrial area to let them ride ponies for 25 cents, five turns around the ring.

"Charles was enthralled with the horses," she said. He was 10 at the time, and wanted to become a jockey.

"But," his mother said, "you know they just don't let a poor boy from Watts come up to be a Willie Shoemaker.

So Charles Sampson, called "Chuckie" by his

friends, set out to become a cowboy.

From the beginning, black cowboys rode the western ranges and were a part of the great cattle drives from Texas up the old Chisholm Trail to the transcontinental railroad in Kansas.

But few were allowed to compete against white cowboys in most rodeos during the first decade of this century.

Instead, these black cowboys "exhibitioned" their skills, then passed the hat among the spectators. Today only two are in the National Cowboy Hall of Fame in Oklahoma City.

And there are no blacks in the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Assn. Hall Of Champions.

slick boxer-puncher who has three wins this year. In his last outing on June 19 at the Showboat he stopped Sonny Perez by technical knockout after five rounds. On April 30 in the Olympic in Los Angeles he decided sturdy Darrel Stovall and on March 19 in the Olympic he halted Raul Bencomo in the fifth.

Baltazar's opponent, Roberto Garcia, Los Angeles, is coming off an exciting and hard-fought 10 round decision over Stovall July 23.

The 23 year old Rocky Garcia, from Placentia, Calif., is a rugged fighter who isn't afraid

to go after an opponent and trade punches, taking one to land one. His last two fights, and his only outings this year, have been at the Showboat.

On June 19 he stopped Reynaldo Zaragoza by technical knockout in the ninth and on May 30, on the undercard of the Cornelius Boza-Edwards — Bobby Chacon World Boxing Council super featherweight title bout, he halted Tony Sanchez in the second.

Garcia established himself as a fighter to be reckoned with on April 17, 1980, when he captured a 10-round decision over the highly touted Fel Clemente in the Olympic.

The card again will be televised nationally over the USA cable network, but blacked out in the Las Vegas area.
