Supt. Perkins Attacked On KVBC-TV Editorial

Valley Broadcasting **Board Chairman James** E. Rogers called for the resignation of Clark **County School District** Superintendent Claude Perkins in a Channel 3 editorial last Wednesday. He stated in the editorial that he and the other Valley Broadcasting Editorial Board members had interviewed Perkins on two occasions and he quoted some of the statements that had been made by Perkins. The editorial pointed out, that despite his intellectual and admnistrative capabilities, Perkins is unable to adequately manage the school personnel and that his inability to interact positively with school personnel is stifling the education process in Clark County.

Perkins was quoted as saying, among other things, of the school board, "The question is not whether I am acceptable to the school board; the question is whether they are acceptable to me," and of the teachers, "My only duty is to pay them..."

However, Perkins said he was quoted out of context in the Channel 3 editorial urging his resignation, and that he has no plans to resign from his position as superintendent, which he has held for three years.

In regard to the quotes on the taped editorial, Perkins said, "I had a different impression of the meetings from what they had. I didn't know there were transcripts of the meetings being made.''

Rogers feels that the school trustees have been too lenient in dealing with Perkins and that they should "go outside for new leaders. We need some new, fresh blood," he said.

Rogers reported that before the editorial was taped, each board member reviewed the script "word for word," and that there was total agreement among all the board membrs on the wording and the content of the editorial.
