BILLIE ROWE'S NOTEBOOK

N'YORK CITY - To Stop the Wine, the Vodka and Gin drinkers a wide ranging promotional campaign to keep Scotch whisky on the lips of Americans has been launched by the Scotch Whisky Information Center. The Center's objective is to increase knowledge and awareness of Scotch. According to the center's staff this spirited spirit has been known and appreciated by people of taste and discrimination since the late 1800's. Today in the U.S. a bottle of Scotch is consumed every tenth of a

Those involved made this known at its inaugural dinner at the posh 4-Seasons between drinks and a potpourri of fancy cuisine. It all made us very interested in the history of this sin soup with a Christian touch.

The first historical reference to Scotch Whisky appears in the Exchequer Rolls in 1494. But Whisky was being distilled for centuries before that date. It is believed that the art of distilling was brought to Scotland by the first Christian monks.

The ancient Celts had a name for the precious liquid they distilled..."Uisge Beatha - The Water Of Life." To them its power to revive tired limbs, to dispel the cold, to lift falling spirits and rekindle

hope was a gift from God. For centuries the Scots kept their whisky for themselves, distilling it on their farms and in their houses. When the Government attempted to tax it, they distilled it secretly on the hillsides and in the glens, for every true Scot believed it was his inalienable right to make whisky. For more than a hundred and fifty years they continued distilling, smuggling their whisky down from the highlands to the towns and cities of the lowlands. The tales of how these whisky smugglers outwitted the hated Excise Officers or Revenue Man have become part of the folklore of Scotland. It was not until early in the 19th Century that distillers in the highlands See ROWE, Page 14
