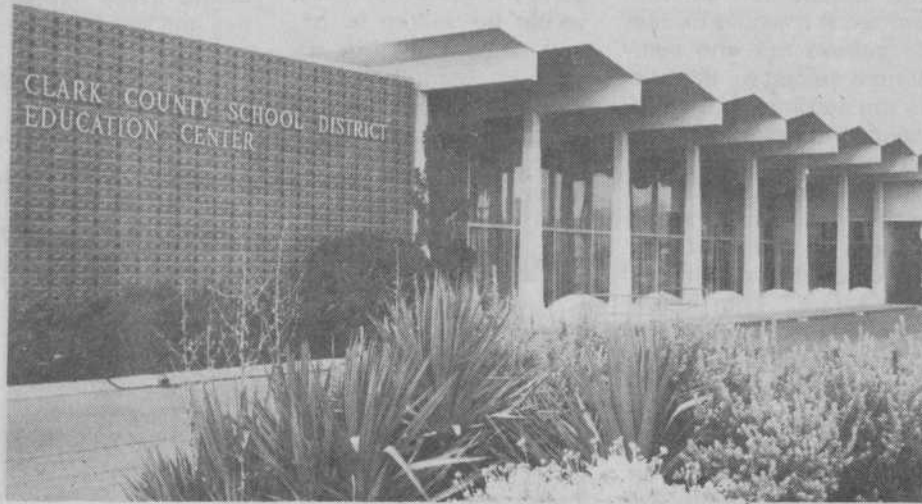


# Education

## CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTIVITIES

**UNLV Registration**  
**Aug. 26 & 27**



CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT BUILDING

Opened in 1964, the Clark County School District's central administrative offices are located at 2832 East Flamingo Road, near Eastern Avenue. The Education Center houses the offices of Dr. Claude G. Perkins, Superintendent of Schools, and six specialized divisions: Business and Finance, Personnel, Facilities, Administrative and Special Student Services, Elementary Education and Secondary Education.

The District's Warehouses and Maintenance buildings, completed in 1966, are located directly south of the Education Center, facing Eucalyptus Drive.

The Transportation Department is located at 4499 West Arville Street in Las Vegas.

Education Television, KLVX-TV, operates out of a \$1.1 million facility at 4210 Channel 10 Drive. This new home for Channel 10 was completed in the fall of 1978 and allows the station greater capability to serve students in the District and the residents of Las Vegas.

The District is controlled by a Board of School Trustees of seven members elected by the people for four year terms. The public is encouraged to attend meetings, which ordinarily are held on Thursdays at 2832 East Flamingo Road, Las Vegas, Nevada.

Entire county comprises one school district, with an area of 7,927 square miles and a 1980 census population of 461,816. The School District is operating 113 schools during the 1981-82 school year:

- 76 Elementary (including seven sixth grade centers)
- 4 special
- 18 junior high
- 15 high schools; 3 are combined junior-senior high

Clark County School District employs about 7,785 persons this year, of which 4400 are certificated personnel.

Advanced education of the professional staff is encouraged and rewarded. More than one-half of the teaching staff hold Masters degrees and above. The average salary (1980) for Clark County teaching personnel was \$18,100 (Estimated by Nevada State Department of Education).

Estimated enrollment 1981-82 is 90,000, kindergarten through 12th grade. In 1971 the school population was 74,737. There has been a 20 percent increase in ten years. The District ranks 24th in enrollment in the nation.

Number of graduating seniors, 1981-5336.

About 62 percent of all school children, (public and private) kindergarten through 12th grade, enrolled in Nevada are in the Clark County School District.

Registration for fall classes at UNLV will be held Aug. 26 and 27 in the Moyer Student Union Building. Students can pick up registration materials and pay the necessary fees from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Students who have picked up packets during the pre-registration period, but have not completed registration, must obtain new class cards and have their packets checked again before paying fees.

The fees, which were recently raised from \$25 to \$28 per credit hour, must be paid by August 28 for those students who are taking seven or more credit hours, or a late fee will be charged.

Late registration will be held from August 31 to September 9. However, Frazier Hall and the deans' department offices will remain open till 7 p.m. only until September 3.

## CLARK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

### SPANISH

A basic course in Spanish designed for those who wish to visit a Spanish speaking country is offered by the Community Service Program of Clark County Community College from September 1-December 8.

Students will learn the essential and useful phrases necessary to tourists. The course is offered at Valley High School on Tuesdays and from 7:00-9:00 p.m. at Valley High School.

### PHARMACY

A consumer course in Home Pharmacy is offered by the Community Service Program of Clark County Community College from August 31-November 16 Mondays from 7:00-9:00 p.m.

This course will include instruction on home health care; discussions of over the counter medicine, drug interaction, dosing and dosages, and of the hazards of medicine.

### RUSSIAN

A beginning course in the Russian language is offered by Clark County Community College beginning September 1 at Valley High School.

The course which will be held Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:00 - 9:00 p.m. will be taught by Maurice Horwitz a former military language interpreter with extensive knowledge of the customs and manners of the Russian people.

Designed for students who wish to obtain a speaking knowledge of the Russian language this introductory course will cover basic vocabulary and simple conversation. The fee is \$45.
