## EDDIE NUNO FACES SLICK TYRONE MOORE, OCT. 22

Hard-hitting Las Vegas Eddie Nuno plus undefeated prospects Young Joe Louis and Richard Sandoval headline the Matador Arena Fights professional boxing card Thursday, Oct. 22, at the Hacienda Resort Hotel and Casino.

Nuno takes on slick Tyrone Moore in a 10-round junior welterweight bout, Louis faces Joe Garcia in a 10-round cruiserweight clash and Sandoval meets Javier Barajas in a 10-round bantamweight battle.

A fourth 10-rounder between featherweights Javier Flores and Refugio Rojas also is slated.

Two other bouts are scheduled on the big six-bout, 50-round card that will be held in the Hacienda's Matador Sports Arena.

Doors to the Matador Sports Arena open at

5:30 p.m. with the first fight starting at 6:10. No 10-round bout will begin before 7.

Tickets for the card, promoted by Bob Arum's Top Rank, Inc., in association with the Hacienda Hotel, Paul Lowden, President, are priced at \$15 for ringside reserved, \$10 for preferred and \$5 for general admission. Tickets are now on sale at the Hacienda.

The card will be televised live throughout the United States by ESPN.

Nuno, who has a 14-4-2 record, is a relentless fighter, one who attacks with both hands and isn't concerned about taking a punch in order to land one. He had an impressive win over Roberto Garcia in his last outing in September.

The slick-boxing Moore, originally from Louisville, Ky., but now

fighting out of Las Vegas, has a 21-1 record and is on a hot streak. His latest win came last month when he beat Jaime Garza. He has won both of his previous fights at the Hacienda, topping Richard Jimenez in August and besting Pablo Gomez in July.

Moore is quick and moves well and has the style to thwart Nuno's pressure tactics.

Louis, whose real name is Eddie Taylor, is fast-becoming one of the top cruiserweights in the world. The Chicago fighter lists a 22-0 record with his biggest win a 10-round decision over Jesse Burnett on Nov. 24, 1979, in Bloomington, Minn. Burnett was ranked No. 3 among cruiserweights in the World Boxing Council's latest ratings. Garcia is from Los Angeles.

Sandoval, from Pomona, Calif., is no

stranger to Hacienda fight fans; he has an 8-0 record with eight knockouts and five of

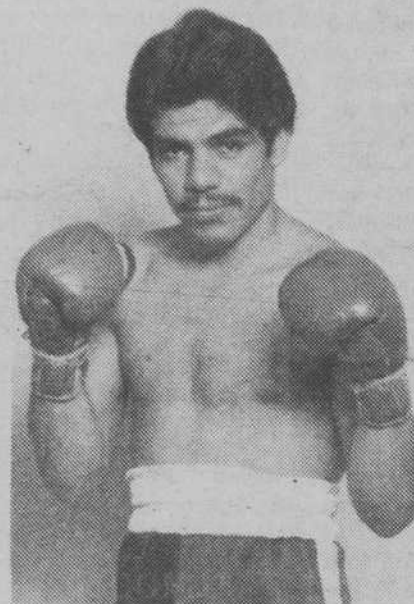
those wins have come here. In February he beat Luis Ruiz, in March it was Paz Mena, in May

it was Lorenzo Ramirez, in June it was Barajas and in July it was Marcelo Camachmo.

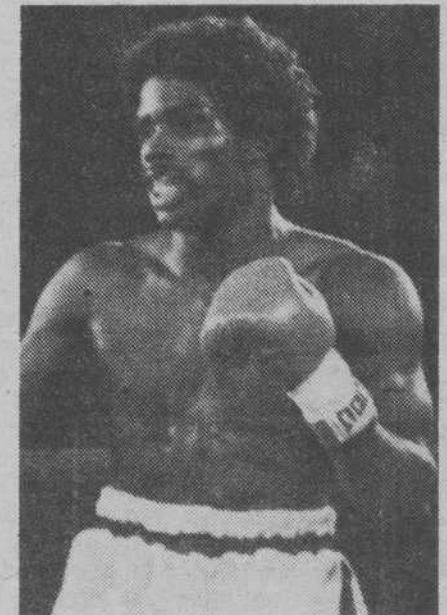
