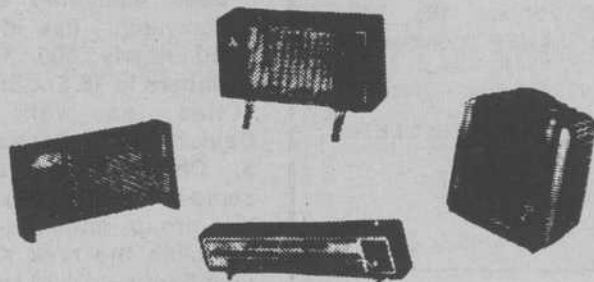

SMOKING, MATCHES AND FIRE

Smoking and matches are the primary causes of house fires which kill thousands of persons each year and result in millions of dollars of property losses. The first line of defense is to avoid these fire hazards in the home. Here are a few:

Use large, deep ashtrays, and never smoke in bed or in a chair when drowsy.

Make sure matches, cigarettes, cigars, and pipe ashes are completely cold before throwing them out.

Never use a match or smoke near flammable liquids or in places such as attics or closets or near stacks of paper.

Be careful that burning cigar or cigarette and pipe embers do not fall into crevices of upholstered furniture where they can smolder without being detected.

Use safety matches and strike a match away from you. Remove one match from the box or folder at a time, and close it before striking.
