The amount of time it takes to report a fire can mean the difference between life and death. The following information is needed:

1. Get out of the burning building and call from a nearby phone.
2. Know the right telephone number for the Fire Department.
3. Give your name, location of the fire, and phone number for call back purposes.
4. Do not hang up until dispatcher instructs you to do so.

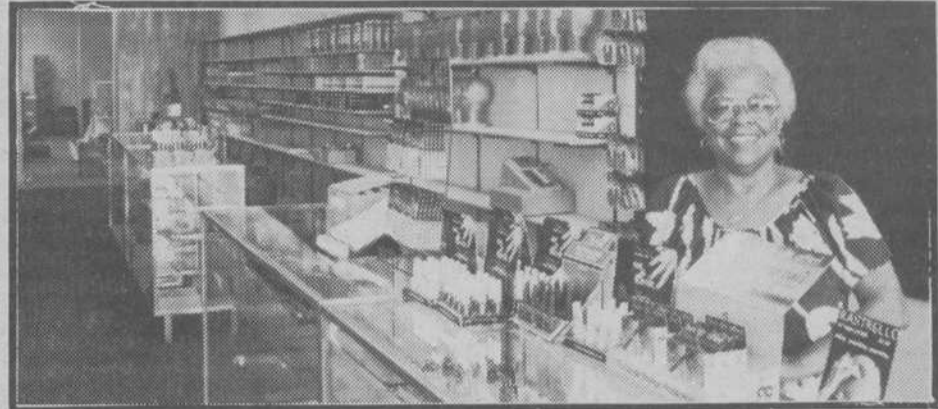
MEADOWS PLAYHOUSE OPENS XMAS CAROL

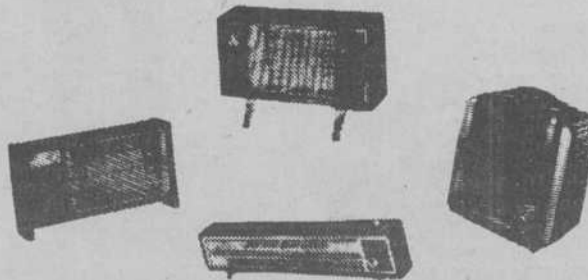
