SAND DRAGS APRIL 24 - 25 ON LVSRA RACING STRIP

The Las Vegas Sand Racers Association, a young but rapidly growing organization, will hold its fourth sand drag competition of the year Saturday and Sunday, Apr. 24 and 25, featuring the top fuel world record holder.

Competition will be held in 16 time brackets on the LVSRA strip located three miles south on U.S. 95 (the Searchlight-Needles Highway) which turns off the Boulder Highway at Railroad Pass be-

tween Henderson and Boulder City.

Times trials will be held Saturday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. with single elimination racing beginning at 9 a.m. Sunday. A total of \$5,000 in prize money is at stake.
