

LIST SETS UP CETA GRANT AWARDS

LAS VEGAS — Saying that "job training remains a cornerstone to the state's economic diversification efforts," Governor Robert List Friday presented more than \$158,000 to five

Nevada job-training organizations as part of the annual CETA grant awards program.

The grants will be used to fund job-training programs for more than 50 CETA eligible participants, adolescent substance abusers, and artists and musicians through the Sierra Arts Foundation.

The award winners include:

- Center for Employment Training, Reno, \$40,000 to provide training for 14 participants in forklift operations, and shipping and receiving for work in the Northern Nevada warehousing industry;

- The Las Vegas Occupational Industrialization Center, \$43,000, to provide clerical-skills training to 30 low-income participants;

- Nevada State Child Care Providers Association, \$30,000 to provide child-care training to 15 participants;

- OIKOS Training for Adolescent Substance Abusers, Reno, to provide job training and vocational counseling to adolescent substance abusers; and,

- Sierra Arts Foundation, Reno, \$20,000, to provide job training, workshops, job development and placement for artists, craftsmen, musicians and dancers, and to provide an Artists Registry for use by the private sector.

"These grants underscore our commitment to provide meaningful and effective job-training programs," the governor said. "They will help put people to work, and to provide Nevada jobs for Nevada workers."

Awards winners are selected by the State CETA office, through a "competitive procurement process," the governor said.

WAITING CHILDREN


Christopher is a slim black boy with a winning smile and a very appealing way about him. At six years of age, Christopher has lived in two different foster homes since his birth. He is currently waiting for someone to care enough to adopt him and give him a "forever" family of his own.

Christopher has had a confusing early life, but he has made some gains during the past year. He has grown considerably and is walking independently. He attends a special school for mentally handicapped children where he receives needed stimulation and speech therapy. Although he cannot speak, Christopher has been imitating sounds and has been heard singing simple words from songs he has learned. He can feed himself and is a good eater. Christopher makes eye contact with others and is generally charming.

Christopher seems interested in music and enjoys playing with toys such as balls and blocks. He will often seem to get lost in a

world of his own and will play with one toy for long periods of time. He needs constant stimulation in his environment both at home and at school.

Christopher would benefit from a two-parent family that could



provide the security and love which all little boys need. An adoptive family would also need to be aware of the excessive amount of stimulation which Christopher must have at home. Christopher will also continue to need a special school environment of individual attention in small classes and a strong program of stimulation.

Prognosis for Christopher's future is poor. He will probably always need special attention for his entire life. An adoptive family must be willing to make a long term commitment to this child. All families will be considered for Christopher, although a two-parent black family is preferred.

HOW YOU CAN ADOPT

The Las Vegas SENTINEL, working with AASK (Aid to Adoption of Special kids) hopes to find homes for these children. AASK is looking for people who can give love and nurturing to hard-to-place children.
