NFL CAGE TEAMS IN BENEFIT FOR UNLV

LAS VEGAS, NV — Four of the National Football League's finest teams will be represented in Las Vegas on May 10 and 11 at the Las Vegas Convention Center in the first BATTLE OF CHAMPIONS basketball tournament.

The colorful and physical event, sponsored by the University Rebels Club, will benefit not only the UNLV Intercollegiate athletic program, but also the

United States Olympic Committee, and will feature two regulation games each night starting at 6:30 p.m.

Featuring members of four NFL teams who have played in the Super Bowl, the tournament will open with the Denver Broncos playing the Oakland Raiders at 6:30 p.m. on May 10, followed by the Dallas Cowboys going against the San Francisco 49ers.

On May 11, the two

winners will meet in the championship game at 8:30 p.m., preceded by the consolation game at 6:30 p.m.

"This could be the start of something really big," said Rebels Club executive director Davey Pearl in making the official announcement of the BATTLE OF CHAMPIONS. "All of these teams are loaded with all-stars and just like on the football field, they play for keeps," ad-

ded Pearl.

The tournament will be televised nationally on ON-TV, a cable TV network, blacked out in Las Vegas, and tickets for the event are on sale now at the UNLV Athletic Ticket Office and several area locations. All seats will be reserved in the 6,380-seat Las Vegas Convention Center for the tournament and are priced at \$10 for the main floor and lodge and \$7 for the balcony for each night. Information regarding group sales or the location of the outlets can be obtained by calling the UNLV athletic ticket office at 739-FANS.

All four NFL teams in the BATTLE OF CHAMPIONS have off-season basketball teams which play as many as 100 games for charitable causes.

The eight-man rosters represent some of the finest talent not only on their respective teams but in the entire NFL.
