

FRIAS MAKES TITLE DEFENSE AGAINST 'BOOM BOOM' SATURDAY

Arturo Frias makes the second defense of his World Boxing Association lightweight championship Saturday, May 8, when he takes on highly regarded Ray "Boom Boom" Mancini in a 15-round bout at the Aladdin Hotel.

Frias and Mancini are among the most aggressive and relentless fighters in the sport today, and this could be one of the best fights to be held in Las Vegas in years.

This is also the first world championship fight to be held at the Aladdin since the hotel, under the promotional guidance of vice president Ash Resnick, became reinvolved in boxing.

The card, a co-promotion with Bob Arum, begins at noon in the Aladdin Theatre for the Performing Arts. Doors to the Aladdin Theatre open at 11:30 a.m.

Tickets for this world championship card are on sale 24 hours a day at the Aladdin casino cage priced at \$100 for ringside, \$50, \$30 and just \$15 for general admission.

The Frias-Mancini titie bout will be nationally televised live by CBS, but will be blacked out in the Las Vegas area.

The 25-year-old Frias, from Montebello, Calif., enters with a 24-1 record with seven knockouts. Mancini, from Youngstown, Ohio, has an even more impressive record of 22-1 with 17 knockouts. The 21-year-old slugger is ranked No. 5 by the World Boxing Council and No. 10 by the WBA.

Frias won the 135-pound crown on Dec. 5, 1981, when, despite taking the fight on just 10 days notice and suffering from torn nose cartilage, he knocked out champion Claude Noel in the eighth round in Las Vegas.

His only defense came on January 30 of this year when he took a technical win in the ninth round over former WBA lightweight King Ernesto Espana in Los Angeles.

Since then Mancini, who constantly pressures his opponents, has stopped Manuel Abedoy in the second and, most recently on January 23, Julio Valdez in the 10th.

Mancini turned pro in 1979 and also won his first 20 fights before suffering his lone setback.

The winner of the Frias-Mancini fight at the Aladdin is scheduled, according to the WBA, to meet Espana within 60 days.

TICKET OUTLETS FOR NFL GAME ANNOUNCED


