The public is invited to view the work Mondays through Fridays, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily. for summer classes by their schools. Transportation is not provided. Tuition is \$42 per pupil. Registration is through the home school and must be received, with payment, no later than June 7.

Secondary summer school will offer a variety of classes for either one or two semesters. Classes will be held Monday through Thursday, June 14 through July 29. The school day will commence with period one at 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. and be tollowed by period two from 9:40 a.m. to 11:40 a.m. Registration and payments must be made on June 10 or 11, from 8 a.m. to noon, at the following summer school sites: Bonanza, Chaparral, Rancho and Burkholder Junior High. Fees have been set at \$42 per one-half credit or \$84 for one full credit.

Upon satisfactory completion of a given class, one-half unit of credit will be granted. If two classes are satisfactorily completed, a full unit of credit will be given. No credit will be given for 7th and 8th grade classes.

Math Facts Contest Success In County

Over 15,000 students in grades 4-6 entered the Math Facts Contest sponsored by the Clark County School District. Winners at the school level will participate in a finals competition at 10 a.m., May 11 - 14 at the Curriculum Services Center, 600 North Ninth Street.

Students entering the contest are timed on their ability to recall 100 "basic facts." Computational skill is recognized as an important objective of a school mathematics program.

The Math Facts Contest is designed to motivate students to master addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts with accuracy and speed. Fourth and fifth grade students are tested on facts through nine. Sixth grade students are tested on facts through twelve.

Fourth, fifth, and sixth grade winners from each assigned zone receive an engraved plaque to be displayed at their school. Three grand champions will be recognized at the June 12 School Board meeting where they will receive trophies to be kept at their school for the following school year. A personal momento will be awarded to the three individual winners.
