BILLIE ROWE'S NOTEBOOK

A WRITE SLAP AT RACIAL PREJUDICE AND HATE

N'YORK CITY: — Athol Fugard, the gifted South African playwright has brought the American Theatre another explosive and revolting drama of racial hatred and its abominable effects on the human emotions. His time bomb, "Mister Harold ... and the Boys," explodes into extraordinary drama at the

Lyceum Theatre with the stench of South Africa's apartheid policy in the nostril, only because the locale of the play was in that hate-aching country. Yet we here were well aware that the cafe, and the characters, could just as easily have been in NYC or Paris. Wherever bias be, in this case, and for all cases, Fugard's "write hand" assault against the corrosive effects of racial bigotry and superiority was bold and meaningful and his actors herald them across the footlights with chilling effects. His critical attitude and censure offered a brilliant insight into the human desecration caused by racial hatred. His direction was just as fine tuned, and a trio of actors were just as fine honed. They were downright brilliant. Performers of exquisite skills, each seemingly what he was cast as and not playing a role. Zakes Mokae, was really "Sam." Danny Glover was undoubtedly "Willie" and Lonny Price was surely "Hally." Combined, the playwright, the setting and the subject made this one, "Mister Harold ... and the Boys," an imaginative drama, out of real life, one to fulfill a creative void on B'way.

Lola Falana


