CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT ACTIVITIES

Trustees Asked To Cut \$1 Million More From CCSD Budget

Clark County School District officials announced today their recommendation to the Board of School Trustees to cut \$1,045,009 from the CCSD operating budget. These cuts are in addition to the \$3,133,793 budget reductions already authorized.

"Every division has made significant cuts for the second time this

year," said Ed Greer, CCSD Associate Superintendent of Finance. "We have made every cut possible while protecting our classroom programs and existing jobs."

"Nobody working for the school district will lose their job as a result of these cuts," said CCSD Executive Management Assistant Ron Hawley. "There will be some

transfers or job assignment changes due to these cutbacks. If approved by the Board, this action will eliminate some CCSD positions, but these can be eliminated through attrition and not affect any one person's job," Hawley said.

This action includes cuts in curriculum consultant services, educational television, custodial services, out-of-district travel, and others.

Among the budget cutbacks is the elimination of competitive, school-versus-school athletics in the junior high schools and elimination of ninth grade football and bas-

ketball programs at the high schools.

The junior high athletic program cuts affect only the interscholastic athletics and will save the District \$190,000. "The intramural programs at every junior high school will be beefed up, offering continued sports competition in the eliminated programs," said Ralph Cadwallader, CCSD Associate Superintendent for Secondary Education.

"Neither junior varsity nor varsity athletic programs are being cut," Cadwallader said.

The expanded intramural program will accommodate all students

who want to continue their athletic activity within their own school, according to school Superintendent Bob Wentz. "Actually, more students will be involved in the intramural programs in most of the same sports as before," Wentz said.

"Students will have every opportunity to develop and participate despite these cuts," Wentz concluded.

The operating budget cutbacks are in response to two factors. The first cause is possible continued loss in local and/or state revenue, along with student enrollments this September that could be

below predicted levels.

The second factor is Governor Robert List's request to Nevada school districts to make budget cuts responding to a projected deficit to make budget cuts responding to a projected deficit in the State Distributive School Fund.

"These cutbacks are the result of considerable interaction between Board members and the (CCSD) administrative cabinet," Greer said. All revenues saved by these cutbacks will be held in a special reserve status until fall when the Board will make a complete and comprehensive study of the financial picture, according to Greer.
