

Food Stamp Suspect Files For Case Dismissal

Henry Robinson, one of the suspects arrested in the recent food stamp "sting" operation filed a motion Monday in federal court to have his 3-count indictment dismissed on the grounds the statute covering the offense is "unconstitutionally vague and overbroad."

Robinson, 1934 N. "H" St., represented by Attorney Richard Wright, said in the suit that the indictment

should be dismissed because it also "lacks particularly in what Robinson must defend himself against."

Robinson was arrested along with 61 other suspects after a 4-month undercover operation by a team of federal, state and local enforcement officers. He was charged with purchasing food stamps at a discounted price on three separate occasions.

County voter registration hours extended

The Clark County Election Department has extended office hours to allow citizens to register to vote in the Sept. 14 primary election.

The deadline is Saturday. The election department at 400 Las Vegas Blvd. South will be open from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. through Saturday evening.

Only new voters or those whose registration has expired and who want to register in the same party are eligible to sign up this week. The deadline to change party affiliation has expired.

Voters can register for the primary at the downtown office, at various campaign headquarters staffed with a deputy registrar and at the Clark County School District headquarters at 2832 E. Flamingo Ave.

Telephone registrations and address changes will not be accepted.

As of early this week, there were 155,792 voters registered in Clark County. Of those 91,106 are Democrats, 53,403 Republicans, 593 Libertarians and 10,690 miscellaneous parties and non-partisans.

The deadline for registration to vote in the Nov. 2 general election is Oct. 2.
