

"42nd STREET" To Debut At Caesars In May

Following nearly a year of negotiations between Broadway producer David Merrick and Alan Margulies, Caesars Palace's Vice President of Entertainment and Special Events, it was officially announced that Tony-winning musical, "42ND STREET" will debut at the resort's 1200-seat Circus Maximus show-room-theatre for a limited engagement in May, 1983.

The addition of "42ND STREET" to the established roster of Caesars Palace headlined entertainers — Frank Sinatra, Diana Ross, Wayne Newton, Ann-Margret, Tom Jones and Willie Nelson — is the most innovative booking policy in Las Vegas. This addition makes Caesars Palace the only hotel offering both superstar headliners as well as Broadway productions.

"42ND STREET" opened in New York on August 25, 1980 where it is still enjoying capacity audiences, and the Caesars Palace engagement will mark the show's west of Chicago debut. Merrick is expected to announce the cast, director and

creative staff for the Caesars Palace production of "42ND STREET" in the near future.

The original direction and dances for "42ND STREET" are by Gower Champion; the lead-ins and crossovers are by Michael Stewart and Mark Bramble (based on the novel by Bradford Ropes); the music is by Harry Warren and the lyrics are by Al Dublin.

Harry Wald, President of Caesars Palace, and Margulies issued a joint statement: "We are flattered and honored that the eminent showman, David Merrick, has chosen Caesars Palace as the first venue west of Chicago to present '42ND STREET'."

Presenting '42ND STREET' has to be the most exciting project Caesars Palace could become involved with and all of us at the hotel are enormously enthusiastic about the production. It's historically a first for Las Vegas and we anticipate it will be one of the most talked about events in our 16 years of existence. Never before has Las Vegas gotten the opportunity to present a hit Broadway show so soon

SANTINI PLANS TO HOST A "PARTY IN THE PARK"

LAS VEGAS — A drawing for a free TV set, free hot dogs, beer, soft drinks and a chance to visit with your congressman will highlight a get-together hosted by Jim Santini on Saturday.

The "old-fashioned-political-rally-minus-all-the-speeches" will be held at the Ethel Pearson Park from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Saturday, Aug. 14. The public is cordially invited to attend.

"This gives us the opportunity to talk informally over a hot dog and drink about the issues in the 1982 Senate campaign," Santini said. "I find this casual give-and-take of ideas a great chance for me to hear what is on your minds and for you to hear my stands on the major issues."

Santini has been the congressman for Nevada since 1974. Prior to that he was a public defender, deputy district attorney and district court judge in Las Vegas.

The Nevada Demo-

crat serves on the Energy and Commerce Committee, the Interior Committee and the Select Committee on Aging. He is chairman of the House Travel and Tourism Caucus and the House Sub-committee on Mines and Mining.

"Putting our people back to work again, lowering ridiculously high interest rates, and making sure that budget cuts are directed away from "people help" programs and targeted towards waste and inefficiency in the Department of Defense, excessive foreign aid and unnecessary agricultural subsidies" are top priorities for Santini. He has also been working to protect Nevada against becoming the dumping ground for the nation's nuclear waste, which he says could hurt the state's image and thus its tourism industry and its ability to attract new industry. Santini also supports urban enterprise zones to attract new industry to the inner city.

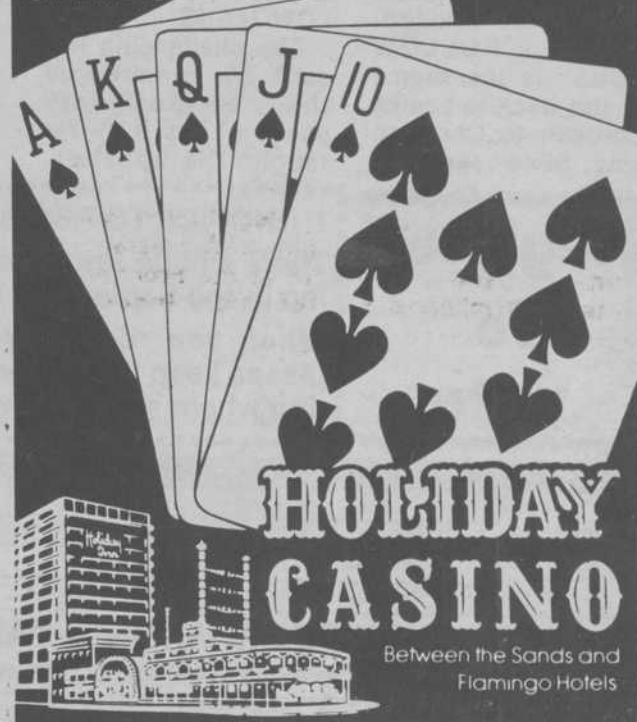
