THE FOLLOWING CLASSES WILL BE CONDUCTED AT NEVADA VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION CENTER, U.S. History, U.S. Government, Consumer Economics, Reading, English, Math, Science, and GED Preparation. Classes are held from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday thru Thursday on an individualized basis only. Registration fees should be paid by check or money order. Classes are approved for credit. REGISTRATION WILL BE CONDUCTED IN THE CLASSROOM ASSIGNED ON THE OPENING NIGHT AS INDICATED ABOVE. CLASSES WILL NOT MEET ON THE FOLLOWING DATES: September 6, October 11, November 1, 11, 18, 25 and December 20, 27, 1982.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

High School Diploma—Standard

Seven to nine units in required subjects (see list).
Ten units of elective subjects. Students who have earned credit prior to fall, 1963 will be required to earn nine units. (Many vocational classes can be taken for credit.)

High School Diploma—G.E.D. Requirements

Seven units, including one unit in American History and one unit in American Government. Evaluation of the remaining five units will be made by the Clark County Evening Adult High School. Physical education will not be counted.

Passing of the General Educational Development Test. Minimum acceptable scores are standard score of 35 or above on each test, and an average standard score of at least 45 on all five sections.

Competency Test

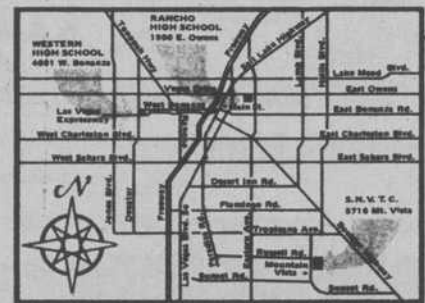
Successful completion of the Nevada State Competency Examination will be required under both methods of graduation for students who enrolled in the 9th grade the fall semester of 1978.

An additional credit in mathematics and world history will be required for students who started the ninth grade the fall of 1979.

*Physical education requirement is waived for students who are working toward diplomas from the Clark County Evening Adult High School. PE credits will not be counted.

Students should register with the instructor in the classroom during the first class unless pre-registration is indicated. All fees are payable at the time of registration. Fees should be paid by check or money order.

FEES

There are no fees for students who do not have a high school diploma and have been out of regular day school for one semester. All others will be charged \$42.00 for each one-half credit.

COUNSELING AND TESTING

Individual counseling with regard to high school completion and vocational courses is available.

The Clark County Evening Adult High School is an official G.E.D. (General Educational Development) test center in Southern Nevada. This test will be administered to qualified persons only.
