"We're trying to preserve in love and harmony the roots of Lillie Hardy Anthony," said event organizer Lucille Bryant, 51, mother of five and grandmother of nine. She is a uniform supervisor at the Stardust Hotel.

The "clan" gathered in 1979 at the then Silverbird Hotel with about 360 attending. They had such a great time they decided to organize and have triannual reunions.

Besides the members enjoying food and entertainment during the two-day festivities, each generation participated in special activities such as dining at a seafood restaurant, going to a disco, playing at a skating rink and having fun at a local theatre.
