Dr. Emmett Rice, a governor of the Federal Reserve Board, who is one of the highest ranking black economists in the nation, encouraged blacks to enter the business field. He pointed out that although blacks are counted as

their share of the gross national product is far less than that. He further pointed out that the new figure for blacks' disposable income is \$175 billion annually. Mayor Richard Hatcher, long-term chief executive of Gary, Ind., ch'person of P.U.S.H.'s board, said his city is fighting a "double curse - racism and Reaganism.
