Sahara Seeks Boxing Programs

There's nothing official as of yet, but the Sahara Hotel is planning on bringing in some major boxing attractions within the next couple of months, hotel official Bernie Yuman said Thursday.

"Right now there is nothing definite," Yuman said. "We're looking for the first deal that comes along that makes any sense."

Yuman was largely responsible for bringing boxing to the Hacienda Hotel, which hosted a couple of championship fights and a monthly ESPN card for two years.

Paul Lowden, who recently acquired the Sahara, said Wednesday in his address to the media, he was very interested in bringing boxing to the hotel.

The fights are expected to be held in the 44,000-square foot Space Center, which could possibly hold up to 6,000 fight fans.

"But we don't want to have fights just for the sake of having fights," Yuman continued. "We don't want to sacrifice quality. We want to bring in some title fights as well as some top notch contenders that are ready to contend for a title."
