



UNITY NETWORK **PURCHASES NEW YORK'S** WWRL

Unity Broadcsating Network - New York, Inc., announced that it has completed the purchase of WWRL — the only full-time AM radio station in New York City serving the Black community.

The acquisition, according to Eugene D. Jackson, Unity Broadcasting president, marks the third major radio station acquisition by Unity Broadcasting within two

Mr. Jackson said that Unity Broadcasting had assumed total management responsibility at WWRL, which has its studios in Woodside, Queens.

The purchase of WWRL, approved by the Federal Communications Commission, was made from the United Negro College Fund. The station was donated to the Fund by Viacom International.

The proceeds of the sale to Unity Broadcasting will be used to assist the College Fund's 41 private, predominently Black colleges and universities. These institutions educate some 50,000 students each year.

The purchase of WWRL follows the acquisition by the company of two leading St. Louis, Missouri radio stations.

In November, 1981, the company acquired KATZ-AM and WZEN-FM from Laclede Radio, Inc. in 1980, Unity purchased two top radio stations in Philadelphia - WDAS-AM and FM.

Mr. Jackson said that WWRL, founded 55 years ago, "Is an established and highly respected station that has consistently demonstrated leadership in providing quality news, information and entertainment programming to its Black listeners throughout the New York Metropolitan area."

"We are confident that, in the years ahead, through innovative programming that is sensitive to the needs and concerns of Black New Yorkers, WWRL will become an even greater educational and entertainment force in New York's communications industry," Mr. Jackson said.
