

**Cannon Appoints Sullivan To Advisory Committee**

LAS VEGAS — Appointment of Carley Sullivan, a 29-year resident of Elko, as a member of his Statewide Advisory Committee was announced by Sen. Howard Cannon.

Mrs. Sullivan has been a management assistant at the Nevada Youth Training Center for the past 16 years. Her husband, Willard, is a hotelman.

She is a past president of the state PTA and president elect of the American Lung Association of Nevada. She is unopposed as a candidate for the State Board of Education to represent 12 rural counties.

**Trend Shows More Women Dentists**

More women are becoming dentists these days, and a study published in a recent issue of the Journal of the American Dental Association indicates that patients should be quite pleased with the trend.

The survey, headed by Dr. Mara White, a dentist, found that patients view female dentists as "more affectionate, cheerful and understanding than male practitioners."

She said the women also were credited with having more sensitivity and compassion and just as much self-reliance and competency as their male colleagues.

In 1980, it was estimated that more than 2,800 women dentists were in practice in the United States, a tenfold increase from 1970. More than 4,200 women are enrolled in dental schools — nearly one in every five students.
