

WHITE, CHANEY, COLLINS, WHITLEY TAKE ELECTION WINS, JARMAN IN ASSEMBLY 18 LOSS

Justice of Peace Earle W. White, Jr., Assemblyman Lonie Chaney, newcomer Assemblyman candidate, Gene Collins, and University Regent June Whitley rode to resounding victories in Tuesday's general election.

Las Vegas Department 5 Justice of Peace Earle White, Jr. won handily in his quest for re-election against Bob Wolf. At Sentinel press time White amassed 26,730 votes against Wolf's 19,185 with 184 of the 335 precincts reporting.

Democrat incumbent Lonie Chaney won his fifth term representing Assembly District 7 in North Las Vegas.

Chaney, 47, vice president of Westside Charter Service, Inc. beat his 24-year-old opponent Linda Brown



received 503 votes, or 21.3 percent.

Democrat Gene Collins, the electrician who shocked District 6

with 4 of 9 precincts reporting against Neal's 220 votes, or 23.4 percent.

In Subdistrict A, incumbent June Whitley was re-elected to her seat as University Regent copping 4,399 votes, or 65.5 percent against her opponent Vonne Chowning's 2,314 votes, or 34.5 percent. Whitley fought to retain the seat she was appointed to in 1979 and won election to in 1980. The area covers North Las Vegas.

Democrat Robert Fay beat Republican Patricia Jarman in the Assembly District 18 race. With 1,773 votes or 58.1 percent against Jarman's 1,279 votes, or 41.9 percent. Jar-

man, who would be the first black woman to serve in the state Legis-

lature, had said she would leave the tax package in tact.

Vegas Hospital, according to testimony. A Nov. 9 arraignment was scheduled before District Judge Joseph Pavlikowski. Brown is being held in lieu of \$50,000 bail.
