

NEW MANUFACTURING FIRM LOCATING IN NUCLEUS PLAZA

Nucleus Plaza, Inc. and Univox-California, Inc. have taken a major step in community revitalization, with the opening of a Las Vegas, Nevada office of UNIVOX in the Nucleus Plaza Shopping Complex.

The announcement was made at a recent press conference by John N. Grayson, President of Univox-California, Inc. and former Deputy Director of the

Office of Minority Business Enterprise, U.S. Chamber of Commerce. Univox, a high technology manufacturing firm, is headquartered in Los Angeles, California and produces a wide range of electronics equipment for the United States Government and the major defense prime contractors. Univox is also the largest producer of reverse osmosis water purifica-

tion equipment to the U.S. military.

According to Mr. Grayson, the Las Vegas office is established to prepare for a Univox Manufacturing plant in West Las Vegas, an area of chronic unemployment. The opening of the plant is contingent upon new business Mr. Grayson anticipates in the next three to six months, which would require Univox to expand its current capability.

Mr. Grayson stated Univox chose Las Vegas as a potential expansion site because of the efforts of Governor Robert List, Senator Paul Laxalt and Senator Howard Cannon, who provided assistance in site selection and made available the information about the advantages of locating in Nevada and about the Job Creation Assistance Program in the state.

Univox is one of the few companies which has successfully established high technology business in a chronic high unemployment area, training and using community residents as the work force. The California Univox Plants are in similar communities in California. Several commen-

dations for outstanding performance have been received by the company from the U.S. Defense Department and major Defense Prime Contractors. Ms. Jeral Webster, Univox's Vice President of Corporate Administration, has been assigned responsibility for the Las Vegas office.

The timely location of Univox-California, Inc. in the Nucleus Plaza Complex is viewed by NPI President John Edmond as "an asset to the community and to Las Vegas, as well as a tremendous boost to the planned efforts to expand local employment and training opportunities for residents."

WOMAN STABBED, SUSPECT CAUGHT

A Las Vegas woman was stabbed in the heart at 9:10 a.m. Tuesday in a liquor store-bar and was near death in Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital, Metro Police said.

Being kept alive by hospital life support systems is Marie Banks, 29, of 516 Jack-

son Ave.

Officers said her assailant, Terry Collins, 31, fled after the stabbing at Friendly Liquors, H and Owens streets, but was arrested less than an hour later at Jerry's Nugget casino in North Las Vegas.

Collins, described as

Banks' former boyfriend, was jailed on a charge of attempted murder.

The stabbing resulted from an ongoing dispute between the couple, police said.

The weapon was described as a knife with a six-inch blade, which was buried to its hilt in Banks' chest.
