"Governor Brown a loser also" Californians Reject Bradley

California's dream of electing the nation's first Black Governor was not seen in Tuesday's general election. Los Angeles Mayor Tom Bradley who attributed his slim defeat to perhaps "the race fac-tor" will not get the op-portunity to lead his state as governor for at least four years. He was defeated by the state's **Republican** Attorney General George Deukmejian. The final vote tally Deukmejian's was 3,740,346 to Bradley's 3,693,286 or or 48.99% to 48.37%.

Bradley was confident that he would win the election going into early Wednesday morning. But this was not to be the case. Ironically enough, he led his opponent even before the general election was underway in the polls as high as 20 percentage points. Bradley noted on Wednesday that the lack of high minority voter turnout that he hoped for, along with last minute "re-thinking" on the race issue was detrimental to his chances. He was even considering a recall due to the closeness of the race.

The other major race in California, that being for the U.S. Senate was also claimed by a Republican. San Diego Mayor Pete Wilson defeated Governor Jerry Brown for the senatorial seat by a ½ million votes. So in the two hotly contested senatorial and gubernatorial races in California, the making of history by placing a controversial and sometimes unpopular governor in the U.S. Senate and putting the popular Black mayor of Los Angeles in the state's governor's mansion will not be made. At least not in the year of 1982.



1982 INTERNATIONAL CHRISTMAS MAILING DATES ANNOUNCED

For those with relatives in the armed services stationed overseas, or who wish to mail holiday greetings and packages to others living in foreign countries, ow is the time to be making holiday mailings, according to the U.S. Postal Service.

Parcels sent to military personnel in Africa, Australia, Central and South America and Southeast Asia have to be mailed by November 8 if shipped by Space Available Mail (SAM), the least expensive means to ship parcels by air.

November is also the month when parcels shipped via Parcel Airlift Mail (PAL) should be sent. Mailers who choose this service for personal military parcels pay the surface rate plus a surcharge. Packages are airlifted domestically to a gateway facility then airlifted on a space available basis from the gateway to the APO (Army or Air Force Post Office).
