

Telecourses Being Implemented At CCCC

Spring is a time of activity and high energy. At CLARK COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE, a new concept in education is being implemented to help students keep pace with the season — Telecourses.

Telecourses are video instructional learning systems brought to you through the cooperation of Channel 10 and CCCC. They are designed from the ground up as complete learning systems.

"Learning systems" basically means that from the outset, the course objectives — the topics to be learned — are carefully defined. Then thorough and thoughtful care is taken in how they are presented to students. A telecourse combines the strengths of various teaching media:

Video presentations have the ability to involve students and explain with images;

The printed word has force and precision. It is lasting and available for continuing reference and enjoyment; and,

Person-to-person dialogue offers the opportunity for interpretation and creative expansion.

All of these are part of a telecourse. A telecourse is far more than just television. It includes readings, interaction with expert faculty, and tests designed to measure and expand your understanding.

Telecourses make learning available on your schedule, in the privacy of your home and at a quick pace.

Registration for Spring semester telecourses begins November 15 at the College, or by telephone with VISA or MASTERCARD.

HUMANITIES THROUGH THE ARTS (ART 100), AMERICA: THE SECOND CENTURY (HIS101), and CHILD PSYCHOLOGY (PSY 233) are the Spring offerings. They will be aired on Channel 10 Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday between 8 and 9 a.m. beginning January 17. Each of these three college credit courses is transferable to other college and university systems.
