

### Commissioner Wilson's Grand Jury Motion Denied

U.S. Magistrate Philip Pro has denied a motion Clark County Commissioner Woodrow Wilson seeking transcripts of the grand jury that indicted him on bribery charges.

The same grand jury, investigating political corruption in Nevada as part of the FBI's 18-month undercover operation Yobo, has also indicted county Commissioner Jack Petitti, state Sen. Floyd Lamb and former state Sen. Eugene Echols on similar charges.

Wilson's trial has been scheduled to begin April 4.

In his decision, disclosed Wednesday by clerks in the U.S. District Court clerk's office, Pro said he denied the motion because prosecutors said their Yobo investigations are continuing, "and disclosure of the grand jury proceedings would frustrate those investigations."

### Unveiling of Memorial to Thunderbirds Announced

On January 18, 1982, Major Norman Lowry, Captain Pete Peterson, Captain Mark Melancon and Captain Willie Mays gave their lives for their country.

Shortly after their untimely death, Judge Gary Davis of North Las Vegas conceived the idea to memorialize these brave Thunderbird pilots and after discussing the idea with Constable Louis Tabat, the project was put into motion.

Constable Tabat enlisted the aid and financial support of many people, including Dick Gillespie, who ultimately gave hundreds of hours of his time and designed the memorial that will be unveiled on March 12, 1983 at 10:30 A.M. at the Public Safety Building in North Las Vegas.

had been in office only four days and was fired by MacDonald after consulting with Bryan.

The matter will be turned over to the Attorney General's office for investigation.

According to MacDonald, McCormick wrote the check then tried to deposit it into his First Interstate account. It was also reported he wrote a second line for \$400.

The bank had been alerted, according to MacDonald and did not accept the check.

"He did not deny it," said MacDonald, "The man had an opportunity of a lifetime and jeopardized his whole future. I do not understand how he could have made a move such as he did."

McCormick headed the Commission's Las Vegas office.

### Bomb threat hearing set

A Justice of the Peace has scheduled a March 24 preliminary hearing for two men charged with trying to extort \$25,000 from the Hacienda Hotel after somebody placed a bogus telephone bomb threat.

Jeffrey Goins, 26, and Kenny White, 24, are scheduled to appear before Justice of the Peace Joseph Bonaventure. Their bail was reduced from \$25,000 to \$2,500 by Justice of the Peace Jim Bixler.

Goins will be represented by the county public defender while attorney Brent Heggie was appointed to handle White's defense.
