

IRS Offers Assistance

FREE TAX HELP NOW AVAILABLE FOR SENIOR CITIZEN TAXPAYERS

Reno — Free Tax Counseling for the Elderly, primarily designed to assist taxpayers 60 years of age or over with their question and income tax preparation, is available throughout Nevada.

Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) is sponsored by the American Association

of Retired People and the Internal Revenue Service.

Volunteers, who are trained by IRS, are able to answer most questions — especially those relating to the elderly — and will prepare federal income tax forms. They will also provide information on topics of special interest to older

Americans such as estimated tax for individuals, the treatment of gain on the sale of a home, and the proper reporting of pension income.

When visiting a TCE site be sure to bring your 1982 tax package that you receive in the mail; wage and earnings statements (W-2's); statements for

recipients of periodic annuities, pensions, retired pay or IRA payments (W-2ps); interest and dividend statements from financial institutions (Form 1099); and other relevant information on income and expenses.
