


Rev. James Allen Elected To Local NAACP Helm

West Las Vegas To Benefit From Job Training Act

The west side of Las Vegas will undoubtedly benefit from expanded job training services under the new Job Training Partnership Act.

In its first meeting on Mar. 4, the State Job Training Coordinating Council unanimously endorsed the proposed designation of two service delivery areas for Nevada and this recommendation was immediately forwarded to Governor Bryan for approval. As a result of this measure, Clark, Lincoln, Nye and Esmeralda Counties would be included in a Southern Service Del-

very Area and receive approximately 5.2 million over the next biennium to implement job training, upgrading, and vocational education services.

Chief elected officials from these counties will be required to work cooperatively to appoint a Private Industry Council. In turn, the PIC and local officials will be responsible for formulating area training plans. It is anticipated that funding decisions will be coordinated with local economic development plans, including the establishment of an enterprise zone.
