Dear Ms. Brown,

We would like to take this opportunity to inform you of Sheriff Moran's new Mobile Home Protection Plan called "Operation Protected Property" (OPP).

This program has been constructed to answer the special needs of Mobile Home Park residents. We have kept in mind the significant proportion of Senior Citizens living within these Parks.

Operation Protected Property is a Crime Prevention Program designed to assist Mobile Home Parks in reducing any crime problems they may be experiencing. The program brings together three proven prevention programs into one package, each of them providing a deterrent to crime.

The program includes Operation Identification which encourages citizens to engrave their Social Security number on their property, thus enhancing law enforcement's ability to trace the items in the event they are stolen or recovered. Each citizen who completes their part will receive decals for their windows, which warn that property has been marked for identification.

A second part of the program teaches participants how to enhance the security of their coach by installing better locks, deadbolts, pinning windows and doors and improved lighting. This lengthens the amount of time it takes for thieves to get in, which has a proven deterrent effect.

The third part of the program is providing instruction to residents on crime awareness; what to look for in their park, and just what to do with observations they make. We teach them to immediately report crimes in progress, and to record suspicious movement.

A final part of this program will be a daily site inspection when feasible, by a Police unit that is normally assigned to the area in which the Mobile Home Park is located. Also, once a month a Patrol Officer will contact the Park Coordinator to address any crime problems or suspicious activity that the park may be experiencing.

With the three individual crime prevention processes incorporated into one package and Police Officers working with the Mobile Home Parks on a daily and monthly basis, these park complexes could become super crime resistant areas in the community.

To organize into a Protected Property group, a Park must provide a Park Coordinator and recruit at least 50% of the park residents. The Crime Prevention Bureau (386-3507), will assist Mobile Home Parks in starting their program, and will provide the necessary training to be park members.

E. Robson Speaker in Vegas

Ernest S. Robson, Executive Vice President for the worldwide Corporate Marketing Division for Monsanto Company will be the speaker at the monthly luncheon of the Southern Nevada Chapter of the American Marketing Association.
