highly-paid skilled jobs and the rest of us sweeping up after them.

And part of that reality is the danger of even greater racial polarization, for history shows that blacks have been relegated to low-pay, low-skill jobs.

Another reality is that even low-skill jobs will demand a degree of education, and even computer literacy, that will render the poorly-educated permanently unemployable.

Great changes in the economy have traditionally been associated with social dislocations and human upheavals. The industrial revolution and the decline of farming offer enough such lessons to warn us of the dangers of swift change that destroys millions of jobs.

Unless planned adjustment to the future economy is begun now, then we may be on the path to terrible suffering. The pain now taking place in America's ghettos and steelbelts is an example of what lies in store for us without intelligent planning.

And part of that planning has to be concerned with preserving production jobs. It's hard to understand a vision of an economy in which people sell each other information, services and hamburgers, but no one actually produces goods.

Neither a blind rush into a new high-tech era nor an equally blind clinging to an outmoded past solve the need to develop a balanced economy with opportunities for all.

Hearing scheduled in attack on invalid

An April 18 preliminary hearing was scheduled Tuesday for two men charged with one count of murder, three counts of sexual assault, two of attempted robbery and two of battery stemming from an attack on an invalid.

Justice of the Peace Kelly Slade scheduled the hearings for Brian Keith Marshall, 18, 1121 W. Monroe Ave., and James Earl Hill, 19, 1000 W. Monroe Ave. The case will be heard

by Justice of the Peace Dan Ahlstrom.

The two are accused of kicking open the door of an apartment occupied by Leroy and Altonia Matthews at 1000 W. Monroe Ave., about 11:30 p.m. March 8, and attacking the couple.

Mrs. Matthews, 56, was sexually assaulted with a stick during the attack. The woman died two days later from wounds sustained in the sexual assault.

Why Dr. King's Birthday Should Be A Holiday

"The birthdate of Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. is January 15. He would have been 54 years old if he had lived. Traditionally, this day in America has been a time for millions of citizens, Black and white, to reflect on, and rededicate the nation to, the purposes of Rev. King's life's work. The passing of time ordinarily diminishes the memory of world leaders. Such is not the case with Dr. King. He stands among a small number of world leaders for whom respect, honor, and admiration have grown tremendously with each passing year.

Dr. King's ideals are as relevant today as they were in the 1960's, a decade which he influenced tremendously. In fact, the values and goals that he stood for then are in great jeopardy today. The U.S. government has lost its moorings, and as Dr. King believed, a government that is not rooted in moral purpose is no government at all. Tragically, that insight is more relevant today than ever.

Every year since 1968 I have introduced legislation to designate Dr. King's birthdate as a national holiday. I shall reintroduce the legislation in the 98th Con-

gress. In each succeeding Congress support for the national holiday bill has grown. In the 97th Congress 105 Members and 23 Senators sponsored the bill. In 1981 the House came within 5 votes of approving it. Fourteen States, as well as the District of Columbia and the Virgin Islands, commemorate January 15 as a public holiday. Four other States designate alternative days in Dr. King's honor. Numerous cities and counties also memorialize his life.

A national holiday in Dr. King's name would not just be a celebration of one man's life, however, extraordinary. Rather, it would be a time for the entire nation to memorialize the ideals he stood for and the moral purpose that we desperately need to recapture today.

I am convinced that someday soon, the nation and its leaders will memorialize Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in the most fitting way possible and create a national public holiday in his name."

The above commentary was excerpted from a statement issued by Michigan Congressman John Conyers at an earlier press conference when plans for King Week (Jan. 9-15) were announced.
