Lois Towles Caesar, Student Of Artur Rubenstein, Passes

(SAN FRANCISCO, CA)-The Links and Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority attracted a large group in international mourners to a special memorial service here for, professor/concert pianist, Lois Towles Caesar, on March 28. She passed in San Francisco 10 days earlier of an unexpected heart attack.

Born in Texarkana, Arkansas, on April 4, 1912, she attended the Dunbar School (Texarkana, Texas) and Wiley College, in Marshall, Texas. Her Graduate Studies were at Iowa State University. At an early age she exhibited enough of an aptitude to be judged a child prodigy. However, it was not until she had become a professor in the music departments of Fisk University and Tennessee A & I State University, which is now Tennessee State College, that her musical talent was spotlighted.

While teaching at Fisk University, Nashville, Tenn., she was brought to the attention of master musician Artur Rubenstein by a reporter on the "Nashville Tennessean". The late conductor-pianist was so impressed with her talents and musicianship he invited her to Beverly Hills, California, where he coached her for one summer. She later journeyed to Paris for further study at Fontainebleau under the tutelage of world

renown instructor, Nedra Boulanger. During her stay in Paris she was presented in a concert at the Salle Playel.

In 1957, she married San Francisco Dentist, Dr. Richard Caesar and resided there the past 26 years, during which she emerged as one of the top social and civic leaders of the Bay area. She was on the Spring Board of the San Francisco Opera Company, former President of the W.A.I.F., International Volunteer Children's Adoptive Agency, Member of the Board of Directors of the San Francisco United Way, Journalist and Secretary of the National American Dental Wives Association and President of the California State Dental Wives Association. She was an Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority member from her college days, member of the San Francisco Links and on the "S.F. Mayor's Commission on Juvenile Problems."

She is survived by her husband Dr. Richard Caesar, and brothers and sisters; Thomas E. Toles, II--Chicago, Ill., Verna Towles Magee-Garland, Arkansas, Atty. Henry A. Towles--Chicago, Ill., Golden Towles Britt--Detroit, Mich., Dorothea Towles Church (Fashion Model)--New York, New York, Marian Towles Phillips--Texarkana, Texas and a host of nieces, nephews and cousins.
